School Responsibilities

The Middlesex County Vocational and Technical School, Piscataway campus will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

The Middlesex County Vocational School's teachers meet state and federal certification stipulations. All teaching staff are highly qualified and certified to teach to their assigned courses. Middlesex County Vocational School operates under an approved curriculum which is aligned to the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards. Staff members participate in professional development activities throughout the school year and during the summer months. Students receive academic assistance through before and after school tutoring as well as additional time during the school day for at-risk students. The Middlesex County Vocational School provides a safe and secure learning environment.

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.

Progress reports will be issued half way through each marking periods. Report cards will be issued on: November 22nd, February 3rd, April 12th, and June 24th
